



Online survey at European level (March-June 2021) addressed to students who participated in Erasmus student mobility during the last three years (Autumn semester 2018 – Spring semester 2021)

Total recorded responded: over 20.000

Total analysed (after data clearance): 7756

Levels of Concern on climate change



Responsibility and Action

- 77% believe individuals impact climate change
- 79.2% believe individuals should take action



Décalage Attitude-Comportement



Malgré le niveau d'inquiétude et la volonté d'agir et d'assumer des responsabilités, les élèves

- choisissent l'avion (compagnies aériennes à bas prix) pour aller et revenir de leur destination de mobilité
- Ne semblent pas préférer les produits issus du commerce équitable ou de seconde main

Les étudiants "très préoccupés" montrent des signes d'un mode de vie plus durable, mais de façon assez marginale par rapport à l'ensemble de l'échantillon.


Des facteurs externes tels que le prix (budget) semblent affecter considérablement leurs habitudes de voyage et de consommation, quelle que soit leur attitude à l'égard du changement climatique.

59,6 %

des étudiants en mobilité considèrent le prix comme le critère le plus important




Going to mobility destination






Mobility and sustainability - How sustainable will your Erasmus experience be

As part of the [Green Erasmus](#) project a workshop on sustainable internationalisation has been developed that universities receiving or sending students on mobility can freely use.
